### Olin Library Reorganizes

Shirley K. Baker, Dean of University Libraries, has announced a reorganization of the Libraries' administrative staff.

As part of the organizational change, Nicholas C. Burckel, Ph.D., formerly Director of Public Services and Collection Development, has been appointed Associate Dean for Collections and Services. Virginia F. Toliver, formerly Director of Library Personnel and Administrative Services, has been named Director of Administration and Planning. A third senior position, Director of Computing and Telecommunications, has been established to reflect the increasing importance of technology and computers in library operations. A national search to fill this position is underway.

"The administrative restructuring will help the Washington University Libraries respond more effectively to the challenges facing us, and to focus on the objectives that will be most important to us in the coming decade," Baker said.

As Associate Dean, Burckel is responsible for all activities in collections and in technical and public services. He came to Washington University in 1986 as Director of Public Services and Collection Development. Burckel has a bachelor's degree in history from Georgetown University and a master's degree in library science from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

In her new position, Toliver coordinates long-range planning for the library system and oversees the recruitment, hiring, evaluation and training of library personnel. She began her career at Washington University in 1981 as an academic library management intern, and was appointed Director of Library Personnel and Administrative Services shortly thereafter. From October 1988 through 1989 Toliver was Acting Director of Technical Services and Library Systems. She has a bachelor's degree in English literature from Jackson(Miss) State University and a master's degree in library science from the University of Illinois-Champaign.

Burckel, Toliver and the new Director of Computing and Telecommunications will serve as members of the Dean's Council, the senior management team that reports to Baker.

In addition to the senior management restructuring, Baker has announced changes in the Libraries' department head group. "The goal of restructuring at this level is to make this as flexible and responsive an organization as possible," Baker said.

Vicky Witte, formerly Head of Social Sciences Services, has been appointed Head of Reference and Information Services. B.J. Johnston, formerly Head of Humanities Services, has been appointed Head of Collection Development. In addition to these two positions, a Head of Departmental Libraries has been created. A national search to fill this position is underway.

As Head of Reference and Information Services, Witte oversees the reference, information, government publication, and interlibrary loan units. In his new position, Johnston is responsible for all activities of the Libraries related to collection development and management. The Head of Departmental Libraries will be responsible for the supervision of organization's art and architecture, biology, chemistry, earth and planetary science, East Asian, mathematics and music libraries.

## Islamic Studies Librarian

The Olin Library System of Washington University in St. Louis is seeking a talented and dynamic individual to serve as Islamic Studies Librarian. The Olin Library System is engaged in a multi-year project of strengthening and expanding its collections and services to correlate with the University's program of enriched research and teaching activities. The Olin Library System consists of a large central library and eight satellite subject libraries.

The Islamic Studies Librarian is responsible for the selection, acquisition, cataloging, and processing of Islamic Studies and related materials. This includes providing reference services and bibliographic instruction in the areas of Islamic studies and related fields and performing other professional duties as required. Qualifications: Candidate must have an MLS from an ALA accredited library school and a fluency in one and a reading knowledge of two of the following languages: Arabic, Persian, and Turkish. A degree in Islamic or Arabic Studies preferred. Desirable qualifications are: academic library cataloging experience with AACR2 and LC Classification; knowledge of bibliographic resources in Arabic, Turkish, and Islamic studies; knowledge of CCLC and other automated systems; knowledge of foreign book trade; an understanding of the information needs of a research university; and the ability to work effectively in a collegial manner in a changing environment.

#### Reference Librarian

## Cooperative Purchasing Manuals

Cooperative purchasing manuals have been mailed to each member institution. A supplement to this manual is included for members with this issue of NETnews. Many new vendors have been added that carry a variety of produces that have not been available to us before at a special discount. I contacted an additional two hundred vendors with special emphasis on FAX equipment, microfilm or microfiche supplies and equipment and computer vendors to seek more preferred vendors for this manual. Some of the vendors from last year complained that they didn't seem to receive many orders from member libraries. Please look through the manual and use these vendors whenever their pricing is lower. The more members use these vendors, the more willing the vendors are to continue their cooperation and sometimes even increase their discount. One vendor included statistics gathered which showed that members had spent \$29,000 last year and saved \$2500. Continue to save.


