## Literacy Hotline: New Weapon in the Fight Against Illiteracy

The problem of illiterocy is one that has captured the interest of people oll ocross America. Here in St. Lovis, on estimoted $7.9 \%$ of odults in the Covity and $17.6 \%$ in the City ore considered functionally illiterote. These stotistics, and those of other cities ocross the country, ore couse for grove concern.

As public oworeness of the problem has increased and community outreach progroms hove become more avoiloble, the need for a centrol cleoringhouse hos grown - o ploce where odults seeking to overcome iliterocy con coll ond get the help they need to win the fight.

The Literoy Hottine, sponsored by the St. Louis Public Librory, is iust such o ploce. The Hotine, os the newest weopon in the bottle ogoinst iliterocy; provides St. Louis oree citizens with occess to ogencies ond orgonizations that ore dedicated to helping people ochieve the gool of literacy. With the Literocy Hotine, help is literally only 0
phone coll owoy.
A cooperative effort berween the St. Louis Public Librory ond opproximately 25 other orgonizations (collectively known os the Gotewoy to literocy), the Literocy Hotine ottempts to motch collers seeking help with the ogencies thot will best suit their individuol needs. For those people who might wish to volunteer their sevices to help someone overcome illiterocy, the Hotine is equally voluoble. It is o lifeline thot works both woys.

The odds ore stocked on the side of literocy os the Hotine stoff do their best to ensure a good moth between collers ond ogencies. All personol information is kept in strictest confidence, though collers ore asked permission for their nomes to be given to the proper literocy ogency so thot more specific information con be sent to them. A follow-up letter thot clearly restotes the information provided by phone ensures that collers will not be left
honging. And just to be doubly sure, the Hotine contocts collers offer a period of time to inquire about the quolity of the senices they received ond perhops provide. further ossistonce.

Since May, 1990, more thon 500 inquiries hove been mode to the Literocy Holine. The St. Louis Public Librory, olong with the Public Relotions Society of Americo, is octively promoting the Hotine in hopes thot even more people con be mode owore and get the help they need.
