NEW PUBLIC LIBRARY FOR CITY OF FERGUSON

On Tuesday, February 7, 1995 voters in the city of Ferguson overwhelmingly approved Proposition L, which calls for a property tax increase of \$.07 per \$100 of assessed valuation for the Ferguson Municipal Public Library. The margin of victory was 1109 FOR and 613 AGAINST, as the library garnered a 65% YES vote in the election. The tax increase will generate an additional \$112, 000 in revenue for the library district, as the library plans to purchase the building at 35 N. Florissant for the purpose of relocating to that address in late spring or early summer of 1995.

The library staff and Board of Trustees are very grateful for the support of the Ferguson community, and tentative plans call for a week's worth of grand re-opening ceremonies at 35 N. Florissant to coincide with the library's 65th anniversary celebration in June. The library has awarded contract to Manske Corporation, Architects to plan the reconfiguration, remodeling, etc. Added features planned for the new library include a 70 seat auditorium, a colorfully expanded children's department, public meeting rooms which may be reserved by Ferguson groups, a permanent office for the FLIERS (Friends of the Library) and full handicapped accessibility.

Look for new materials, services and programs at the library in the near future, as the library collection will have room to grow in the expansive new facilities during 1995.

The Ferguson Municipal Public Library is pleased to announce that they have received a \$30,000 commitment from the Rotary Club of Ferguson for the renovation of the children's department of the new library. While the library's renovation, reconfiguration and relocation projects should be completed in time for a summer "Grand Re-Opening" it is certain that the "Ferguson Rotary Club Children's Room" will be a highlight of the new library. The Rotary Club has generously pledged the revenue from their annual golf tournament fund raiser to the library for the next four years, with the total donation of \$30,000 going toward the carpeting, painting, furnishing and equipping of the children's room.

library has contracted with Manske Corporation, Architects for the plan and design of this project, and now that we know these extra funds will be available to us for the children's room during the next four years we can allocate our resources to other aspects of this project accordingly, " indicated Library Director Fred Moore. " The total amount of this project was to have cost the library district \$465,000, which included \$395,000 for the purchase of the building at 35 N. Florissant. With \$70,000 allocated for the renovation, reconfiguration and relocation project, the additional donation pledged by the Rotary Club of Ferguson will have a significant impact on the entire project."


