## Document Delivery Using Ariel and the Internet

Ariel is a document transmission system from Research Libraries Group. Using commercially available hardware and RLG's software, users can scan articles, photos, and similar documents, transmit the resulting electronic images over the Internet to another Ariel workstation, and print them on a laser printer. Ariel is faster, more reliable, and less expensive to use that fax, and produces images of greater resolution and quality.

Sixteen Missouri higher education institutions participated in a group purchase of Ariel software and another five are already using Ariel. The consortium price of $\$ 635$ for the Ariel for Windows software is available until December 1 and is available to anyone who wishes to participate. Ariel software is designed to work on PCs connected to a local area network, which in turn has a direct high-speed connection to the Internet. RLG does not recommend using Ariel over low-speed or dial-up connections to the Internet. Equipment requirements include 486/33 PC or better with 8 MB RAM, a scanner, and a laser printer.
