Grant Award to Muni Libraries

The Municipal Library Consortium of St. Louis County was awarded \$259,832 in state funds toward the purchase of a new automated system and accompanying conversion. This award is part of a \$3 million competitive grant program funded by the Missouri legislature and administered by the Missouri State Library. These grants will fund library automation projects in Missouri's public libraries.

University City Library will house the computer system and all consortium libraries will participate in its use. The new Dynix system will provide on-line catalog access to more than 520,000 items owned by eight Municipal Library Consortium members. Patrons and staff from these libraries will be able to view holdings of all eight member libraries; they will also be able to see availability of items from any terminal in the shared system. The members are: University City, Kirkwood, Ferguson, Brentwood, Valley Park, Richmond Heights, Rock Hill, and Maplewood. Together these libraries serve a population of 127,340.

Rock Hill librarian Kelly Sallade is pleased about the grant award. "It will allow us to upgrade our current automation to a state-of-the-art system" she said. The Rock Hill library owns 30,000 items and circulates about 30,000 items each year. The shared system will provide expanded resources to all of Rock Hill's patrons.

OCLC WILL MAKE MISSOURI SERIAL HOLDINGS AVAILABLE VIA FIRSTSEARCH

OCLC has announced a plan to create and load a new database of more than 7 million Local Data Records (LDRs) linked to some 750,000 bibliographic records in WorldCat (the OCLC Online Union Catalog). LDRs provide volume and year-specific information for serials for those libraries that have utilized this OCLC service. Holdings of Missouri libraries that have contributed to the Missouri Union List on OCLC will appear in this new database.

The database will look and "feel" like any other FirstSearch database. It will contain the WorldCat records for any serial to which an institution has attached an LDR. Searchable fields will include library symbol or name, state, and 4-character union list symbol as well as standard FirstSearch access points. The hit list will display serial title, format (i.e. paper, microfiche, electronic) and holding library symbol or name. From the record display users will be able to retrieve a list of libraries in their state or region that hold a specific title.

This new FirstSearch database is scheduled to be made available sometime in Summer 1997. Missouri libraries interested in subscribing to FirstSearch services should call Tracy Byerly at MLNC, (314) 918-7222 or (800) 969-6562.

JOINS SLRLN

The Lewis & Clark Library System has joined the SLRLN as a consortium member. The following is a list of benefits this provides our members:

Accessibility into the GateNet database via the Internet and reciprocal library and/or patron privileges with the database. Patron privileges include searching and placing electronic reserves. This capability would enhance the interlibrary loan possibilities for all involved parties. Currently GateNet had over 650,000 MARC records and over 1,380,000 items in the database.

Connection to Illinois' state-wide delivery service, via the switching point between St. Louis County Library and Lewis & Clark Library System. The Lewis & Clark Library System provides direct delivery to all its 140 members and acts as a switching point to the other Illinois Library Systems and Major Illinois Academic Libraries.

Participation and registration for LCLS workshops at the member's fees. The majority of our workshops are at no cost for the participants. Those workshops with a registration fee would be at the same cost as for our other member libraries.

Copies of the LCLS member directory.

SLRLN members would receive the system's electronic and print newsletters. Additionally, SLRLN members would be encouraged to include items in both newsletters. The weekly electronic newsletter acts as a bulletin to inform our members of current events, to post job openings, to advertize workshops, to exchange library material, etc. The print newsletter is produced quarterly and is subject related, past issues have centered on reference, planning, and lobbying.
