Recap of Fall Workshop:

Orchestrating Successful Events at Your Library – Florissant Valley Branch of St. Louis County Library

Two panels discussed hosting author events at your library. Authors Amanda Doyle and Sandra Thompson Williams shared suggestions to make an author visit successful. Some of the key points were that authors need to sell their books, they appreciate a flexible space, and make sure you have refreshments for the audience. Libraries are great venues for authors because people attend events on purpose and are very engaged audiences. Librarian experts Carrie Robb from St. Louis County Library, Sarah Nielson from St. Charles City County Library District, and Jeff Bargielski of Francis Howell Middle School shared their experiences. They discussed how they manage events, partner with publishers or book stores, and PR strategies for author visits. Their best advice for novices was to: look for partners, keep trying, and be a gracious host.

Many participants met at Hendel's for lunch after the workshop to network and share experiences.
