#### INFOPASS

The INFOPASS program allows participating member libraries to send their patrons to other participating libraries to check out materials.

#### COOPERATIVE PURCHASING

This is a list of local and national vendors of library materials and supplies that offer discounts of 5 - 60 % to members only.

#### WORKSHOPS

The network holds three or more inexpensive continuing education workshops each year and members attend at ½ the cost of not members.

#### SOCIAL EVENTS

The network holds an annual dinner or luncheon meeting and social plus occasional open houses to tour libraries or after hour socials.

#### DIRECTORY DISCOUNTS

The Directory of Libraries in the St. Louis Area is published biannually and member prices are discounted currently by 25%.

#### FREE COPIES PROGRAM

This program allows participating libraries to use an ALA form to request a small number of photocopies under 20 at no cost.

## **NEWSLETTER**

The NETnews is published six times per year to advise members of relevant activities and programs. It also lists job openings, free give-aways, etc. This is free to members.

## **ACCREDITATION AIDE**

The membership in the network with access to the many collections in the St. Louis area has helped many small institutions obtain and retain accreditation.

## ***GREATER ST. LOUIS LIBRARY CLUB***

The purpose of this club is to promote the library arts in the greater St. Louis community, and membership is open to anyone who pays dues (currently \$3/year). The meetings are usually on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday (occasionally on Saturday). Meetings start about 5 p.m. with a box supper price \$10 or less, if possible. Then around 6:30 there is a talk and/or a tour, depending on the location. Members can come to just the program and skip the dinner. There are no formal business meetings other than a financial report and introduction of new officers at the first meeting of the year. (usually there are 3 or 4 gatherings per year).

Some of the recent meetings: Becker Library at Wash U Medical, Emerson Library at Webster U., Histrionics Theater at Mo. Historical, and Piper Palm House at Tower Grove Park.

The first two programs planned for 2004 are Jean Gosebrink of St. Louis Public talking about the 1904 World's Fair, late Jan. or Feb. (place not yet decided), and a talk by a St. Louis author probably March or April at Al Smith's Feasting Fox Restaurant at Grand and Meramec.

Work cooperatively within Technical and Access Services and throughout Library and Information Services to recommend and implement standards, policies, procedures and workflows. Serve as a resource person for faculty and staff throughout the library concerning issues surrounding acquisitions and serials including non-print collections. Train Technical and Access Services staff in the use of Endeavor as it relates to acquisitions and serials.

**TERM OF CONTRACT:** Assistant or Associate Professor, fiscal year appointment, academic year tenure-track, continuing contract.
