#### ANNUAL DINNER MEETING

St. Louis Regional Library Network held its annual dinner meeting on Wednesday, April 28 at Assumption Greek Orthodox Church. Forty-three people attended for an evening that was supposed to be equal parts business and pleasure; to no one's apparent dismay, the scales tipped towards pleasure as the evening wore on.

The first order of business was the annual meeting, conducted by Council President Ellen Eliceiri. There were two main agenda items:

#### 1. BY LAW REVISIONS:

Council members cast ballots on whether to accept two changes to the Network's By-Laws. The changes, one a change to the Network's Mission Statement and the other an addition to membership categories, passed unanimously. The text of those changes follows.

#### ARTICLE II Purpose

The mission of the St. Louis Regional Library network is to provide opportunities and forums for libraries and librarians to share resources, and to learn with and from each other. To fulfill its mission, the Network shall identify the needs and resources of the library community served by the Network, develop and offer cooperative programs deemed appropriate by member libraries and evaluate and assess those needs and programs.

## Article IV: Membership

Section 4 Retired library personnel may join SLRLN at a reduced rate determined by Council. This membership will allow them to attend network functions at member rate. They will not have voting privileges nor can they be on the Council.

Section 5 Library-related institutions in the area may join at a rate determined by Council.

This membership will allow them to attend network functions at member rate and have access to online "Directory of Libraries in the St. Louis Area". They will not have voting privileges nor can they be on the Council.

## 2. PRESENTATION OF THE BUDGET

Bernyce Christiansen presented and reviewed the Network budget for the upcoming fiscal year.
