St. Louis Regional Library Network (SLRLN) is a non-profit member organization that provides opportunities and forums for local libraries and librarians to share resources and knowledge. The Network began in 1978 and includes members from public, academic, school, and special libraries.

In 2019, SLRLN welcomed new members, including Goldfarb School of Nursing at Barnes Jewish College, one individual, and one student. SLRLN welcomed Terrence Cotton (Maryville University) and Pam Withrow (Jefferson County Public Library) as new members of the SLRLN Council and reelected Jeff Bargielski (Francis Howell Middle School) to serve a second term.
